Successful Chapters Leaverage Members' Skills to Fulfull Mission

As volunteer organizations, the success of our chapter depends largely on our ability to know what skills our members possess and to leverage those skills to help the chapter fulfill its mission. If it has been some time since you last did an inventory of the skills of your members, I would strongly encourage you to take

the time to find out what secret skills your members possess. I am certain that you will find that there are some hidden gems among your members.

Once you have those skills identified, how can you leverage them to help the chapter? An article that I came across recently, gave some tips to use as you work to utilize the newly found skills of the chapter members.

- Identify the roles What are the roles and tasks the chapter needs? Think about the skills, experience, and availability of your members and match them with the needs of the chapter.
- 2. Communicate the vision Share with your members the vision and purpose of the tasks you are asking them to complete. Highlight how the work of the members can create positive change for the chapter.
- Provide training and support Give your members the training they need to accomplish the task that you have asked them to complete. Supervise and give ongoing guidance as needed to ensure the quality that you are expecting. Having access to the necessary resources are key or members to perform effectively and confidently.
- 4. Recognize and reward Make sure to recognize

and reward your members for their efforts and achievements. Appreciate and acknowledge their contributions and skills and the difference that they make in the chapter. This can be as simple as a thank-you note or certificate.

- 5. Foster collaboration and learning Encourage your members to communicate, network, and share best practices with the rest of the chapter members. Especially since they will be the next wave of people that you will need to take on the tasks and be the future leaders of the chapter.
- 6. Evaluate and improve Monitor and measure the results of the tasks. Identify any opportunities and challenges of the tasks and use these insights to inform your decision- making, planning, and improvement of future projects and activities.

I hope that you will find these tips to be helpful as your chapters continue to make progress on the goals that you have set for the year. Feel free to reach out if I can be of any assistance.

New Contest Rules Open the Door for Smaller Choruses to Compete



In other C&J news - the SCJC (Society **Contest & Judging** Committee) announced a change last November, reducing from 12 to 9 the minimum number of singers required to be officially classified as a chorus. This is good news for smaller chapters, giving them the opportunity to compete in chorus contests. CSD has

adjusted our Plateau I rules to match this adjustment.

We are now in the beginning of the intensive 3-year program to train & certify new judges. The SCJC has reviewed the applications for all categories, and announced that CSD has 7 approved applicants: 2 Administrative, 3 Musicality, 1 Performance, and 1 Singing. We wish these applicants well as they begin their training at Candidate School this summer. CSD's Spring Conventions are always exciting! It is the perfect opportunity for us to get a sneak-peek at our district's top quartets as they vie to qualify for International. We have more than 20 quartets registered, and a third of them have either qualified in prior years, or are right on the cusp. Will this be the year some new ones make the jump to the Big Show?



Spring is also when we crown both our Youth and Seniors Quartet district champions. These contests usually provide some the most interesting & entertaining fresh takes and old standards of the entire weekend.

And let's not forget the Chorus Contest! Although we have a smaller field of competitors than recent years, it includes the newest chorus in our district, and "regional" groups that have drawn members from multiple chapters. They are all in search of the CSD Small Chorus Championship, as well as Plateau I & Plateau II awards. And the Ozark Overtones are looking to qualify for an invitation the 2025 Midwinter Seniors Chorus Contest to be held in San Antonio.

Coaching a guartet or chorus, or a **Musical Director in** all things musical can be a successful experience. Quartet coaching, many times, is experienced in preparation for a contest,. Chorus coaching, many times, is experienced in preparation for contests. **Musical Director's** mentoring can occur at Leadership

Academies, Harmony University, and sometimes, when there is time, during the Chorus Coaching sessions.

Yes, we assume that Musical Directors offer coaching

in rehearsals, listening to chapter quartets, but who mentors the Musical Director? The responsibilities lie within the chapter by securing and encouraging funds each year for "continuing education" of the Musical Director.
